Maternity Foundation Projects in Ethiopia

At Maternity Foundation we believe that it should not cost life to give life. Most maternal deaths happen in poor and fragile settings, but the majority can be prevented if the women receive quality care from a skilled healthcare professional.

Therefore, Maternity Foundation builds midwifery and healthcare knowledge and skills among healthcare professionals in low-resource areas through innovative learning programmes and cost-effective digital health solutions, such as the Safe Delivery App.

Maternity Foundation is an international NGO with offices in Ethiopia, India and Denmark. We have engagements in multiple countries across Sub-Saharan Africa, Middle East and North Africa, and Southeast Asia. In 2023, we expanded our work into Latin America and the Caribbean. We use innovative digital health solutions and learning programs to support healthcare professionals with access to instant, competency-based learning and training and international best practice clinical guidelines, so they can provide quality care to women and babies.

Our work contributes to strengthening national health systems by supporting the pre-service and in-service training of skilled birth attendants and building communities of practice, by promoting quality of care and driving demand for RMNCH services, and by contributing to the evidence base around digital health and healthcare professional capacity building.

We work with a diverse group of partners and stakeholders to reduce maternal and neonatal mortality in low resource settings: we partner with national governments, Ministries of Health, midwifery and nursing associations, NGOs, UN agencies, research institutes, tech agencies and private sector partners.

Snapshot: The Safe Delivery App in Ethiopia (numbers from 2023)

- More than 15,000 users in Ethiopia
- 95% of users are healthcare professionals
- Almost 2600 users accessing the MyLearning platform to build and test their clinical knowledge
- 112 MyLearners have passed all levels to become Safe Delivery Champions
- Most commonly accessed content in the SDA are modules on infection prevention, post abortion care and hypertension
